

# **Membership Satisfaction Survey Results**

California Clubhouse conducts an annual Member Satisfaction Survey to assess the level of satisfaction among our community. The survey allows us to know if we are meeting member needs and improving quality of life. The survey results are shared a Community Meeting where we review and create a plan to initiate growth areas.

Here are the results for our Fiscal Year 2020-2021 survey:



According to our survey results, members that participated in our program saw an increase in social relationships, increased independence and reduced hospital visits.

Some of feedback received through the survey are as follows: (these are individual responses, there were no common themes).

- The program seems to be a bit repetitive.
- Request for more walking activities and peer reach out (member to member calls).
- Suggestions for more weekend activities and staff-moderated evening chats.

Through a mental health counselor.

# What's Transitional Employment?

The placement is part-time (12-15 hours) and time limited (6-9 months), Members are supported through the entire placement - support varies but may include SSI/SSDI support and daily/week check ins.

# **Movie Social Review** By Dave B.




