Clubhouse Updates

Unit Structure Transformation

Quarter 4 has been quite an eventful time at the Clubhouse! We've divided into units: The Hospitality Unit and The Business Unit. The Hospitality Unit has been busy shopping, preparing meals and reorganizing the kitchen space. The Business Unit has been handling reception, member intake, maintenance, fundraising, and the newsletter. A big part of restructuring was actually reorganizing the physical layout of the Clubhouse. We separated all of the tables and split the units up in opposite ends of the space, with the business unit on the left and the hospitality unit on the right. There is much more room in the Clubhouse.

The separation of the units in the Clubhouse has made everything run more efficiently. We have members that have separated into the two units as well as some who are in both. We also have been hosting Zoom during the Work Order Day to engage those who cannot make it into the Clubhouse. Members have the opportunity to learn clerical tasks, administration, and communications in the business unit as well as meal planning, shopping, and cooking/baking in the hospitality unit.

Business Unit

The Business Unit has been hard at work reorganizing our space and developing new efficient ways to get through our workflow. Some of the recent additions to the business unit have been new white boards, cork boards, stand up desks, and computers allowing the unit to run more efficiently. We are using a huge whiteboard as our unit task board. We also developed a new board just to list upcoming prospective member tours and orientations. We will be using a large corkboard for our community announcements, and we have stand up desks to assist us with virtual programming and moving around the unit.



Hospitality Unit

The Hospitality Unit is delighted that they can cook meals in the building again. "I think it has boosted the morale and helped invite people to the building," said Masako. The meal program enhances the camaraderie and closeness of Clubhouse, because the Hospitality Unit works as a team to produce meals that the whole community can enjoy together. This unit does everything: they plan the meals, grocery shop for the week, prepare the food, plate the meal, and serve. Then, after lunch, they clean the kitchen and wash the dishes. Also, they open, operate, and close Brian's Cafe, for those who want extra treats. Next in the works is bringing back Baker's Club!



Career Development Updates

In April, the Career Development Dinner featured a guest speaker from NAMI, which is short for the National Alliance of Mental Illness. She discussed the Peer Pal program with the folks who attended the dinner. Below, two members wrote about their experiences from that evening.

For the April Career Development dinner, Audrey from NAMI talked to us about the Peer Pal program, who would make a good Peer Pal, and the benefits of being a Peer Pal. Being a Peer Pal, you help repair relationships, acknowledge the Peer's point of view, and learn to apologize when appropriate. Audrey spoke about how to get involved both as a peer and as a mentor. There are opportunities for both. The time commitment is usually only an hour or two per week, so it is easy to manage either as a peer or as a mentor. They try to match people in the program quickly, so there isn't a long wait time. You can find out how to apply to be a peer or a mentor by going to the NAMI San Mateo County website. It sounds like a fantastic opportunity either as a peer or a mentor to get involved and have someone to build a relationship with.




